Publication Ethics and Publication Malpractice Statement

The Ussher Society welcomes the submission of papers related to any aspect of the geology or geomorphology of South-West England and related geographical areas, along with papers of broad interest and significance to geologists and geomorphologists working in South-West England. However, the Society is also concerned that material published in our Journal meets the standards of expected ethical behaviour involved in the act of publishing and is not the subject of any publication malpractice.

Accordingly, in submitting a paper for publication in *Geoscience in South-West England*, authors are responsible to ensure:

1. The manuscript is an unpublished original work.
2. The manuscript is not currently being considered for publication in another journal.
3. All data in the manuscript are real and authentic.
4. All material within the manuscript conforms to internationally accepted ethical guidelines.
5. All sources used in the creation of the manuscript are acknowledged.
6. All copyrights and permissions are cleared or obtained.
7. All authors have been personally and actively involved in substantive work leading to the manuscript, and will hold themselves jointly and individually responsible for its content.
8. Any conflict of interest is notified to the Editor.

Manuscripts will only be accepted for publication following double refereeing by reviewers with appropriate expertise and experience. The factors that are taken into account in review include relevance, soundness, significance, originality, readability and language, and suitability of graphical material. Following refereeing, invitation to revise and resubmit does not guarantee acceptance of the revised manuscript. Paper acceptance is constrained by such legal requirements as shall then be in force regarding libel, copyright infringement and plagiarism.

The Editor has the responsibility and authority to reject or accept a submission for the Journal, but in doing so will ensure:

1. The decision is based solely on the importance, originality, clarity and relevance of the submission to the scope of *Geoscience in South-West England*.
2. The anonymity of referees is protected, if requested when asked in the reviewing process.
3. Publication of errata pages when needed.
