Conference Circular - Call for Papers & Conference Attendance

The Ussher Society is pleased to announce its 62nd Annual Conference will be held at the Duke of Cornwall Hotel, Plymouth, Devon, from Thursday, 9th, to Saturday, 11th of January 2025. This 2 + 1 day conference for Earth and environmental scientists working in South-west England and related areas includes 2 days of presentations and a field excursion day. The presentation days will be Thursday & Friday – oral and/or poster presentations will be welcomed in all areas of the geosciences relating to South-west England.

CONFERENCE PROGRAMME

South-west geology, geomorphology and palaeontology are alive and well!

Plymouth, has much to celebrate, historically the sheltered deep-water anchorages of The Sound and the Hamoaze, at the estuary of the Tamar, provided Plymouth an historically important role as one of the country's major naval ports. The area was also the site of extraction for a range of minerals.

The original detailed geological survey of Plymouth and adjacent one-inch sheets, just over a century ago, was by one of the Survey's great field geologists, W A E Ussher. Leveridge et al., updated the survey in 2002 with details demonstrating for the first time the existence of a Palaeozoic passive margin, and data and discussion required for infrastructural developments and environmentally linked programmes within the district.

Now-a-days the geology of Plymouth is important enough that Plymouth Sound, Shores and Cliffs are a Site of Special Scientific Interest. Also the University of Plymouth offers earth science courses that are designed around a core syllabus which provides students with the skills and expertise that are critical to tackle today's challenges of global environmental change. Both the University and Royal William Yard are promoting their geology with interactive Geo Trails.

Scott Simpson Lecturer: Julian Murton

Areas of expertise: Periglacial features in SW England

Following the recent publication from Jenny Bennett and co-authors, which reviewed the severe cold climate and periglacial conditions that affected Devon for much of Quaternary, Julian Murton will draw on his extensive career and active research on Arctic permafrost regions in the Northern Hemisphere, experimental periglacial geomorphology, and Quaternary and engineering geology of past permafrost and periglacial regions, to discuss Periglacial features found in SW England,

Conference field excursion.

Lower to Upper Devonian facies, faunas – and structural evolution - of the Bovisand to Mountbatten coast, Plymouth.

The eastern coast of Plymouth sounds provides an excellent opportunity to explore the evolution of Lower to Middle Devonian facies from non-marine Dartmouth Group, through shallow marine Meadfoot Group – with a possible fluvial event – through off-shore mudrocks and volcanics to a Middle Devonian carbonate platform (with coralline faunas). Despite a general *stratigraphical* younging northwards, the sequence has been interpreted as being largely inverted and complex tectonic models have been proposed to account for the transition from non-marine to carbonate platform environments. But do they really ‘work’ and are other interpretations possible?

The aim of the excursion, therefore, is to ‘get back to the rocks’ and begin to explore the field evidence for the current models of the evolution of the facies of the historical ‘Type’ Devonian of SW England. Discussion from sedimentological and structural perspectives will definitely be encouraged!

Further details about the itinerary, including meeting places, will be provided in due course, but are likely to include car-parking at Bovisand Bay (pay), Jennycliff and Mountbatten (no payment required).

Opportunities for lunch stops will also be explored.

Discounted accommodation rates for anyone attending the conference, are as follows

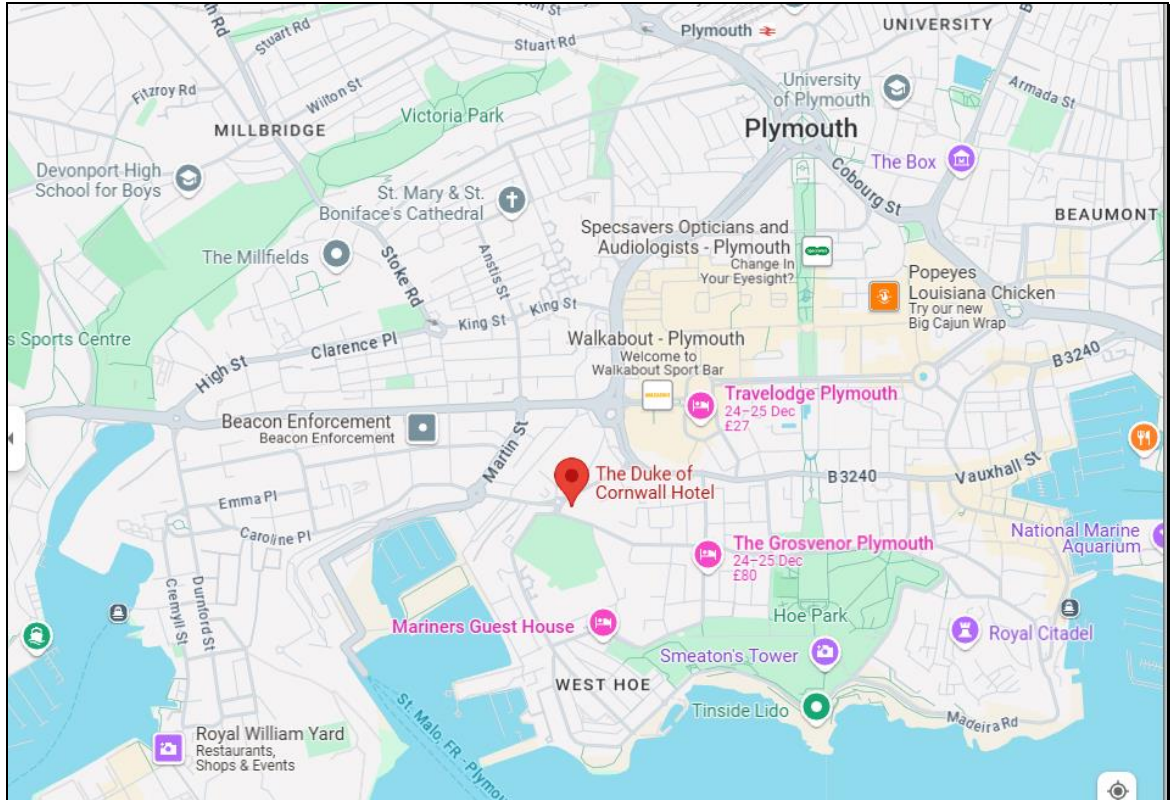
